

Legalization of documents

The document(s) submitted to the Embassy for legalization must be authenticated by the Department of Foreign Affairs, Trade and Development of Canada (Authentication and Service of Documents Section).

The following should also accompany the document(s) submitted to the Embassy for legalization:

- Individuals should provide a document that confirms his or her identity, as well as a declaration addressed to the Consular Section, dated and signed by the individual, which also identifies the document to be legalized by the Consular Section and for what purpose.
Note: *Azerbaijani passport copies must be certified true copies*
- Legal entities should present on their letterhead and signed by an authorized representative of the legal entity a request for legalization to the Consular Section, which includes the legal entity's address, identifies the document to be legalized and states the intended use of the document
- The fee for legalization is - **\$50 US dollars** per each document as a *money order* only
- Documents and translations must be printed
- If mailed, the request must include a prepaid return envelope
