

Legalization of documents

The document(s) submitted to the Embassy for legalization must be authenticated by Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade Canada (Authentication and Service of Documents Section).

The followings should also accompany the document(s) submitted to the Embassy for legalization:

- Individuals should also provide a document that confirms his or her identity, as well as a declaration addressed to the Consular Section, dated and signed by the individual, which also identifies the document to be legalized by the Consular Section and for what purpose
- Legal entities should present on their letterhead and signed by an authorized representative of the legal entity a request for legalization to the Consular Section, which includes the legal entity's address, identifies the document to be legalized and states the intended use of the document
- The fee for legalization is - **\$50 US dollars** per each document as a *money order* only
- Each document submitted to the Consular Section must also be accompanied by a copy of the entire original
- Documents and translations must be printed
- If mailed, the request must include a prepaid return envelope
